FREMONT PANTRY PROVIDES LIFELINE TO NEIGHBORS IN NEED

Fremont's Care Corps LifeHouse Pantry—one of the Food Bank's 514 Network Partners—serves Dodge County, Nebraska residents needing food assistance. Over the last five years, pantry officials say they've seen an overwhelming spike in demand. "We are serving 6x the number of meals since 2019. We couldn't do this without the Food Bank. There's just no way we could feed this many people," says Julie Sleister, Chief Operating Officer.

Shelby, a mother who recently overcame homelessness, says the support from the pantry is critical to her family's survival. "I started using the pantry when I was homeless. It means a lot. It helps to know my son and I are not going to starve."

Shelby says the feeling of knowing she's taken care of means the most to her. "I feel hope when I come here because I need help and they're giving it to me. I can just come here, and I feel relief."

Another neighbor, Abbie, says the pantry allows her family to live a healthy life. "There's much less waste when you can select the items your family needs and wants. And when you have good food choices, it's easier to be healthy."

Members of the Food Bank's Board of Directors and staff recently volunteered to support neighbors like Abbie and Shelby. For board member Eva Roberts, it was a full circle moment as she witnessed the connection between the Food Bank, its pantry partners, and neighbors in need.

"One of the wonderful things about serving on the board is how its impact is amplified by the hundreds of pantry partners who ensure the food supplied by the Food Bank ends up on tables. I am grateful for this opportunity to volunteer and meet some of the families who benefit from this network of generosity."

It's that continued generosity that helps the Food Bank keep shelves stocked at this pantry—and hundreds of others across our 93-county service area. Thank you for playing an integral role in the fight against hunger.


A NOTE FROM OUR PRESIDENT & CEO

Spring is officially here, which means the Food Bank is one step closer to having our future facility at 84th and L in Omaha completed! As we continue to face economic uncertainty and new challenges that create additional barriers to deploying our mission, this facility could not come at a better time. Construction milestones include erecting the superstructure and wall panels, and completing the roof. We hope to have our certificate of occupancy in mid-December with a potential move-in date of late January 2026.

Our team has also made phenomenal progress on our capital campaign goal. As of press time on this newsletter, we've raised \$19.8 million from 1,066 donors which is 73.3% of our \$27 million goal. ADVOCATING FOR HEARTLAND NEIGHBORS

Food bank programs across the country are only as strong as the support they receive. Food Bank for the Heartland's Government Relations team is monitoring legislation at state and federal levels and is working to protect and expand vital programs to ensure no one in the Heartland goes hungry.

We recently joined forces with the Iowa Food Bank Association for Hunger-Free Day on the Hill in Des Moines to promote Double Up Food Bucks and Choose Iowa, programs that would bolster access to locally grown and healthy foods, and to schedule upcoming appointments with Iowa delegates this summer.

Within the Nebraska Legislature, we are closely monitoring SNAP benefits legislation. We advocated for policies that would keep gross eligibility for SNAP at 165% of the federal poverty level and would remove the ban on those who hold a drug felony. These measures are integral to ensure that Nebraskans continue to have access to federal nutrition programs. The Nebraska Legislature has also held committee hearings on other anti-hunger related measures including a Universal School Meals program, SNAP restaurant meals, TANF, and a Grocer Investment fund.

At the federal level, Food Bank for the Heartland and Food Bank of Lincoln traveled to Washington, D.C., to advocate for our neighbors and partners—educating our federal delegation on the importance of strong and enhanced federal nutrition programs and policies.

As we further engage our community of supporters in becoming food security advocates, we've recently updated our website to enable individuals to sign up and receive timely updates on combating hunger across our communities.
